Travel to Oxford:

Rail services: Trains run at least once an hour between Oxford and London, and twice an hour during peak times. Oxford is also on the main cross-country routes. The Oxford train station is a 20 minute walk from Keble College. There is a good taxi service from the station.

Coach/bus: There are frequent buses, 24 hours a day, between London (Victoria Bus Station) and Oxford, run by the Oxford Bus Company and the Oxford Tube. There are also direct and regular services to Oxford from Heathrow and Gatwick airports operated by the Oxford Bus Company. Coach services from other parts of the country are available with National Express and other providers. For information on bus services and timetables call 0870 574 777.

Directions for Drivers: Many of Oxford's streets are now closed to traffic and we recommend using the Park and Ride car parks located on the outskirts of the city (<https://www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/cms/public-site/park-and-ride>). The High Street is closed to traffic between 7:30 am and 6:30 pm.

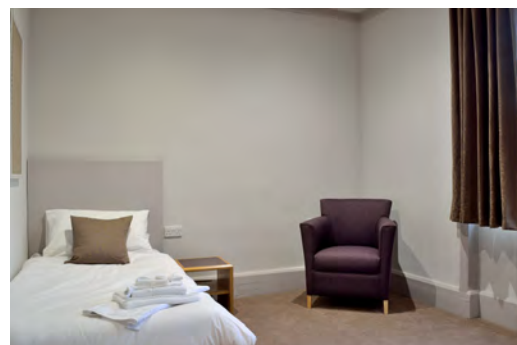
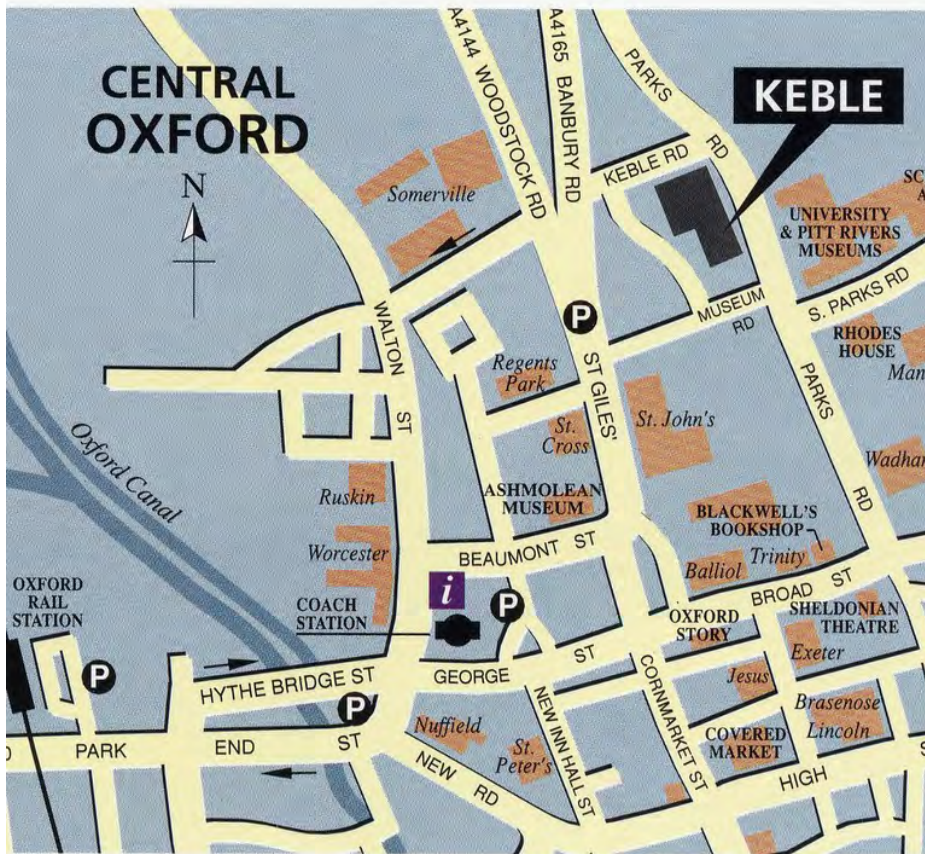
Accommodation

- Abstracts may cover any area related to metalloproteinases.
- Abstracts should be no longer than 350 words and include an Introduction, Materials & Methods, Results and Discussion in a Word document.
- Do not include any figures or tables, and do not include references.
- All accepted abstracts will be presented as a poster.
- A number of abstracts will be selected for oral presentation (10 minutes duration + 5 minutes discussion) at the meeting. Speakers will be notified in advance of the meeting.

Information for Poster Presenters

- Posters must be in portrait form. Poster boards are 1 m wide x 2 m high. This will accommodate an A0 poster (84 cm wide x 120 cm high).
- Velcro will be provided to affix posters to boards.
- Please put your poster up on Thursday 4th August immediately upon arrival. Posters will remain up for the duration of the meeting.
- Each board will have a poster number on it. The number for your poster will be listed in the meeting abstracts booklet. Please only put your poster up on the board that has the corresponding number.
- **Presenters of odd-numbered posters:** Please be available at your poster for discussion during the first poster session (14h30-16h00) on Thursday 4th August.
- **Presenters of even-numbered posters:** Please be available at your poster for discussion during the second poster session (12h00-13h30) on Friday 5th August.

Poster prizes

- There will be a poster competition for PhD students and post-docs in their first 3 years post-graduation (please indicate if you qualify for consideration).
- Posters eligible for consideration for a poster prize will be marked * in the abstract booklet and on the poster board number card.
- Two prizes will be awarded.
